

2. Qualifications and Experience

a. Description of experience providing similar services described in the statement of needs

Established in 1967, BARBRI is a leading global legal education company. BARBRI's proven U.S. bar review courses have helped over 1.4 million examinees pass a U.S. bar exam, including tens of thousands of foreign-trained attorneys and the overwhelming majority of GMU law graduates.

Since 2012, BARBRI's international team, headquartered in London, has worked closely with our Chicago-based team of editors to craft six-month and ten-month bar review courses specifically designed to meet the needs of foreign-trained attorneys seeking qualification in the U.S. More than 5,000 foreign-trained candidates have passed through the BARBRI Extended Bar Review program.

Today, BARBRI is applying its legal exam expertise beyond U.S. bar exams. In England and Wales, we now offer preparation for the new Solicitor's Qualifying Exam. BARBRI provides training for paralegals in the U.S. through its Center for Legal Studies and BARBRI's Legal Ed division partners with law schools to deliver curriculum, assessment, and data analytics to law schools across the U.S.

b. Documented evidence of success, including pass rates

3. Specific Plan (Methodology)

a. Approach to providing services

Our approach is straightforward. When we work with a law school, we work from the posture of partner, not vendor. We recognize that there is not a “one size fits all” approach that can work with any student body -- especially one consisting of foreign-trained attorneys. A data-first focus informs every aspect of our course and every recommendation we make to our school partners. Regular meetings will be held during the delivery of each course to evaluate progress and performance. After each bar exam, a complete evaluation of the course, including a detailed data analysis, will be conducted to identify programmatic strengths and areas for improvement.

b. Outline of programs

Customization of Program to Meet Curriculum Map and Completion Tracking

GMU’s Flex-LLM in U.S. law offers a “one year to bar” study program with bar-related courses distributed across summer, fall, and spring semesters. BARBRI’s six-month or ten-month programs can be customized to meet the needs of Flex-LLM students. The extended bar review course features customizable weekly assignment blocks that can be sequenced to match the Flex-LLM curriculum, including extending the course over 12 months. Unlike the daily schedule of the traditional 10-week bar review course





offered to U.S. J.D. graduates, the weekly assignment format of the extended bar review allows Flex-LLM students to incorporate bar study more easily into their LLM course work.

The BARBRI Student Improvement Reporting System provides GMU faculty with real-time multi-dimensional reporting for each student during bar review. The summary page compares each student's progress against the total number of activities assigned to date and the average amount of work completed by all other students studying for the same exam. 

Subject-specific instruction

BARBRI's faculty is a remarkable collection of teachers and scholars. They have a proven track record delivering engaging lectures that make the complex understandable and the mundane memorable. Today, the BARBRI faculty teaches from completely re-designed lectures with on-screen graphics and embedded assessments to increase retention and engagement. 

d. Student expectations and outcomes

Course overview



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MBE Assessment

After each lecture, students work a series of carefully curated MBE practice questions. These questions initially feature a mixture of black-letter-law and MBE-type items to help isolate whether a student's struggle is related to rule mastery or legal reasoning and application.

As the course progresses, students move from single-subject to mixed-subject MBE practice questions. Initially, items are delivered online using BARBRI's proprietary branching algorithm, which varies each student's path through the items to increase engagement and avoid burnout or despair. Detailed progress, performance, and percentile ranking reporting is provided to each student throughout bar study.



Another essential feature is BARBRI's Simulated MBE. This test, which is well correlated to the actual MBE, is taken by tens of thousands of students each year and provides the most accurate snapshot of where a student sits on the curve before sitting for the bar exam.

Lastly, approximately one week before the actual MBE, Flex-LLM law students will have access to BARBRI's 100 question MBE "final exam," featuring 100 questions carefully curated from the most recently released NCBE items, including the latest released questions from the NCBE study aid.
